



## Indianapolis Airport Authority receives \$5 million in federal ARRA funds

INDIANAPOLIS—The Indianapolis Airport Authority (IAA) has received 5 million in federal funding under the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA).

Part of ARRA's mandate calls for a \$150 billion investment in new infrastructure for the nation's roads, bridges, and mass transit systems.

- IAA received \$3.7 million in funding for the high-priority rehabilitation of Taxiway A at Mount Comfort Airport. The pavement on this runway, which is nearly 30 years old, needs to be replaced. Work on the project will begin this summer after the Indianapolis Air Show and is expected to take about 75 days.
- IAA also received \$1.3 million in funding for a 4,500-gallon aircraft rescue and firefighting, or ARFF, vehicle. The vehicle will enable firefighters at Indianapolis International Airport to meet the minimum standards and regulations set by the Federal Aviation Administration for acceptable response times in the event of aircraft or airport emergencies.
